These conflicts often center on issues like parking, property maintenance, loud parties and the resulting conflicts are typically an issue of real or perceived disrespect and lack of common courtesy.

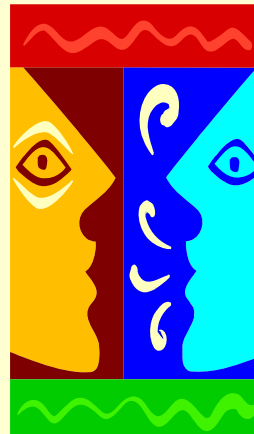
“Just Say Hi” is asking for neighbors to step forward and introduce themselves to one another. **Bringing people together by “Just saying hi” and meeting one another.**

**THE MISSION** of the Good Neighbor Program is to build a greater understanding and respect between all groups coexisting in a neighborhood by encouraging personal interaction and a mutual understanding of the diversity of interests of these groups. Instead of only differences, these diverse groups can seek and find commonality to be used as a foundation to address concerns, develop solutions and, in short, be better neighbors. Ongoing work will proceed with the efforts of the UND Student Senate/City Council subcommittee, established in Fall 2006.



**THE History** of the Good Neighbor program evolved from discussions with the UND Student Government/City Council sub-committee

as a way to encourage mutual respect and common courtesy. These efforts began with the joint meetings of this group and the full City Council and Student Senate. There has also been an ice cream social hosted by Student Government leaders and City Council members.
