## Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures, 2003

The *Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures* surveys were mailed in the winter/spring of 2003 to all municipalities with populations 10,000 and over. Of the 3,215 cities, towns, villages, boroughs, and townships that received surveys, 1,645 responded (51.2%).
