## Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures, 1997

The *Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures* surveys were mailed in the winter/spring of 1997 to all municipalities with populations 10,000 and over. Of the 2,860 cities, towns, villages, boroughs, and townships that received surveys, 1,381 responded (48.3%).
