The *Police and Fire Personnel, Salaries, and Expenditures* surveys were mailed in the winter/spring of 2006 to all municipalities with populations 10,000 and over. Of the 3,257 cities, towns, villages, boroughs, and townships that received surveys, 1,407 responded (43.2%).
