take the steps to be a leader with the professional development series



The Professional Development Series (PDS) is designed to meet several objectives:

- Build knowledge and skills in 22 core competencies important for success as a City of Goodyear supervisor
- Provide essential tools and resources to be an effective leader in achieving organizational goals
- Promote excellence in the execution of City of Goodyear Human Resources policies, guidelines, and practices
- Establish partnerships and communications among supervisors across the organization.

Employees must attend at least 11 of 13 scheduled classes and Leadership Mirror to earn the PDS certificate at that series' graduation. If a participant misses two sessions and receives a certificate, make-up sessions are required. Graduation will be held on September 8. Four classes in the PDS fulfill annual employee training requirements: Interviewing and Selection and Conflict Resolution (ethics); and Crucial Conversations and Employment Law (harassment prevention).

employee referral program is a bonus for you



Since the inception of the employee referral program in July 2007, there have been 13 employees who have received referral bonuses for applicants they referred who were hired. As a result of the referrals made by current employees, we have EIGHT new Police Officers, a Recruitment Specialist, a Staff Assistant, a Parks Worker, a Building Permit Technician and a Mail and Copy Clerk. We even have one employee who has received two referral payments for his referrals of two Police Officers who were hired.

If you are referring an applicant, make sure that they select "Referred by a City of Goodyear Employee" under the "How did you hear about us?" section and that they list your name under "If you were referred by a City of Goodyear Employee, please list referring employee's name" section so that you will receive credit for the referral.

Check out the Employee Referral Program requirements in Guideline 315 of the policy manual (look on eSite under Policies) to find out how you can earn \$200 to \$400 by making a referral.

what to do after an automobile accident

If you are ever involved in an automobile accident while on the job, here are some simple steps to follow.

- 1. Stop immediately, but do not obstruct traffic if possible.
- 2. Keep calm.
- 3. Call 9-1-1.
- 4. Help injured, but do not move anyone unless necessary.
- 5. Make no admission and take no blame.
- 6. Do not accept claim settlements on the spot.
- 7. Secure contact information of other drivers, witnesses, and injured persons.
- 8. Make a rough drawing of the scene, showing position of cars and other details.
- 9. Collect make, model, color, location and license numbers of all cars involved. Take pictures of the scene if you have a camera.
- 10. Call Risk Management at 623-882-7754 or 623-693-0018 any time of day.
