

2022 GEOGRAPHICAL & POSITION-TYPE ROTATION BY REGION

Important: The following summary chart pertains to the **2022 election year only**. The Geographical Protocols were written to support the rotation of state/country and position-type representation on the Board and are customized and adopted by the leadership in each region. **The rotation of states and position-types change each year and requirements can differ by region.** Candidates and Regional Nominating Committee members are encouraged to view the full details on the Geographical Protocols which can be found in each of the six region's <u>Regional Nominating Agreements</u>.

Generally, the Regional Nominating Agreements provide that no state or country may succeed itself on the board (there should be a minimum one-year gap for any state or country's representation on the board), unless there is no other qualified candidate. Furthermore, the nominations process will generally give preference to states or countries that have not been recently represented on the Board unless there is no other qualified candidate. Exceptions: Seats dedicated to Canada, Texas, and California. Affiliate members that are also Corporate members may only run for a position in their region's designated non-CAO year*. The historical geographic representation on the Board from each region are found in History of State/Country Rotations of Vice Presidents by Region.

The following chart summarizes the geographical & position-type rotation for the 2022 election year by region.
