
The City of Novi takes pride in providing residents and businesses with comprehensive, quality communications on all topics events, emergencies, happenings, and fiscal responsibility. This publication shares examples of what the City of Novi is doing to keep a healthy bottom line through cost-saving measures and/or service enhancements and partnerships in several areas.

Where does your property tax dollar go?

The images to the right show the allocation of "Your Property Tax Dollar" for fiscal year 2009-10 (homestead taxpayer). The City of Novi receives 29¢ for every property tax dollar paid. Out of that 29¢, the City allocates spending into seven categories. The City of Novi overall taxable values continue to fare relatively well (declining less than most), supported by a diverse tax base of residential and other properties, combined with some new construction.

Prudent Practices

- Effective January 1, the Library Board approved elimination of time and ½ pay on Sundays which will save the library approximately \$30,000 annually.
- In-house maintenance is now performed on items such as window replacement, power washing buildings, and hot water heaters, resulting in limited labor cost to outside companies.
- In an effort to reduce annual fuel cost and control emission of vehicle exhaust, the Novi Police
 Department has initiated a no-idle policy which has reduced idle time by more than 47%.
- The City has been making multiple year projections for purposes of decision making since 2002. Projections range from a scope of services to all funds influenced by property tax revenue (debt, special revenue and the general funds). The City looks forward and back to provide analytical information in preparing current 3-year projections (referred to as "fiscal analysis" included in the City's budget document). This "look ahead" provides the City Manager's office important information in decision making and planning for the City's future.
- Standard & Poor's confirmed the City of Novi's general obligation bonds as AA+, defined as "having excellent financial security and being highly safe."



- The Novi Fire Department has received \$1,950 in grant funding to purchase supplies and equipment related to the H1N1 flu.
- Novi's Household Hazardous Waste Day collection was the largest event ever held with 1,557 residents participating in 2009.
- Electronic Paystubs have replaced paper pay statements and are available to City employees by a password-protected e-mail. This has resulted in cost savings by eliminating paper from the payroll process and the labor associated with distribution; while offering a great service to employees.
- The City earned its third consecutive Gold Promoting Active Communities Award by the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness.



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
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- The City of Novi has entered an agreement with four other local municipalities to purchase a large outdoor movie screen used for the Sizzling Summer Art Series. The City's share of the screen purchase is less than rental fees incurred during a twoyear period. The purchase will save the City approximately \$34,000 over the expected 10-year "life" of the screen.
- The City of Novi partnered with Commerce Township to add a back to the entryway sign at M-5 and Fourteen Mile Road. This spring, Commerce Township will work with City of Novi contractors to re-landscape the sign, providing one installation that services two purposes, rather than dueling entryway signage facing off from each other.
- The Novi Police and Fire Administration functions have consolidated into the Department of Public Safety. This restructuring will save the City at least \$100,000 in the 2010/11 budget and beyond by not replacing the full-time Fire Chief position. An additional \$425,000 in savings is estimated for next year with the elimination of the vacant positions in Police and Fire departments due to attrition and eliminations.

- City of Novi Boards and Commissions will receive their information packets electronically more often, eliminating delivery overtime expenses.
- The City of Novi will save \$280, 845 (net present value benefit is \$165,981 or 5.824%) with the sale of 2010 Novi Building Authority Refunding Bonds for Meadowbrook Commons. Additionally, with the sale of the 2010 Refunding Bonds, the City of Novi will save \$333,250 (net present value benefit is \$224,214 or 4.553%).
- The City of Novi recently welcomed new businesses — Once Upon A Child, MEGA Fun & Fitness, HUMMER Cadillac of Novi, Leo's Sports Bar and Grill, Bagger Dave's, Deli Unique, and Pineland Restaurant — to the community.






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- The City of Novi has traditionally ordered midgrade/89 octane gasoline for the pump island at the Field Services Complex. Higher octane gas was previously needed for police patrol cars, but now all gasoline-powered cars and light trucks in the fleet can run efficiently and at the same level of performance with regular unleaded gas with 87 octane. By ordering 87 octane gas exclusively, the City expects to see an annual savings of approximately \$6,750 per year.
- The City of Novi recognized a \$3,400 savings by having Department of Public Services staff frame the roof of the Island Lake Booster Station prior to having the contractor complete the project.
- The City of Novi's Information Technology Department reviewed and adjusted the cellular communication plan, reducing the number of devices and negotiating vendor concessions, which will produce an estimated annual cost savings of \$24,840.
- The City of Novi no longer accepts employee per diem meal expenses associated with training sessions, conferences or workshops.
- A new Art in the Park program is being initiated at Fuerst Park at no cost the citizens. The Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services Department has partnered with Emagine Entertainment and Midwest Sculpture Initiative to create a public sculpture exhibit. The exhibit will be installed in May, 2010.
- The City of Novi recently welcomed new businesses — Healthy Hearing, Planet Fitness, and Michigan Office Solutions — to the community.
