What We Offer:

- Web-Based and Print Resources: The Institute website provides access to all of ILG's public engagement guides, tip sheets and reports, as well as to public engagement stories from cities and counties throughout California. Also find audio and video recordings of conference sessions, access to ILG public engagement newsletters, statewide rosters of citizen academies and youth commissions, and much more. All these resources may be downloaded without cost. Print copies of our longer publications may also be ordered from the Institute.
- Conference Sessions, Trainings and Webinars: Educational opportunities include: public
 engagement-related presentations and sessions at League of California Cities, California State Association of

 topic-specific webinars.
- Consultation: Guidance is available on public engagement strategy, process options, and assessment; and Institute staff will work with cities and counties to help develop their ongoing capacity for the appropriate uses of public engagement.
- **Inclusive Engagement:** The Institute offers resources, stories and leading practices to engage communities and populations that are typically less involved in local public engagement activities. Resources include meeting translation equipment that is available for loan to local agencies.
