Su Jung Spa Shooting

February 21, 2012

- 5 killed in Homicide-Suicide
- Domestic Violence related (brother shot his two sisters and their husbands before killing himself)
- 20 people were inside the spa at the time of the shooting
- Murder weapon: .45 caliber handgun, a Kimber Eclipse Target II 1911
- Incident captured on surveillance video





Su Jung Spa Shooting

The Law Enforcement Response

- 911 call ("Shots fired") was received at 8:45 p.m.
- Response time: under 3 minutes
- Officers cleared the building while EMS staged
- 2 females and 2 males were found deceased inside the nail salon
- 1 injured male was transported to the hospital where he later died
- The GBI was contacted to process the crime scene
- Search warrants were obtained for the business and the suspect's vehicle parked outside the business







Su Jung Spa Shooting Managing the Media

- Designated a safe staging area for the media
- Only PIO was authorized to provide information to the media
- Designated spokesperson for the incident







Su Jung Spa Shooting Lessons Learned

- Recognize the importance of Active Shooter training for Law Enforcement (Officers responded appropriately by entering the spa immediately to locate and stop the threat.)
- **Be involved**. Attend Active Shooter training and become familiar with your police department's policies, so that you understand emergency management's response.
- **Keep citizens informed.** Designate a spokesperson for the media but ensure that you maintain investigative integrity.



Su Jung Spa Shooting Lessons Learned

- **Prepare for diversity.** Employ multilingual personnel. Have access to interpreters or the AT&T language line.
- **Provide support for victims and their families**. A Police Chaplain should be made available to meet with victims and their families as well as the officers who responded to the incident.
