The U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) has published its Interim Notice of Funding Availability (Interim Notice) regarding its new "TIGER II" competitive grant program, a \$600M successor to the popular \$1.5B TIGER program included in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The Interim

Notice outlines application procedures, and eligibility and project selection criteria, and highlights the program's shift in focus from near-term job creation to long-term outcomes.

Only \$60M of an authorized \$200M was allocated to TIFIA under the original TIGER program.


USDOT's new authority under TIGER II to award TIFIA assistance in lieu of, or in addition to, grant funding is expected to stimulate greater utilization of the TIFIA program.


TIGER II includes several additional aspects of note:

- Amounts Restrictions: TIGER II grants must be for at least \$10M and cannot exceed \$200M.
 No state can receive more than 25% of the funds.
- Federal Share Capped at 80%: For most projects, the federal share will be limited to 80%, requiring a 20% local match.
- Rural Projects: In a significant shift from the original program, TIGER II requires the investment of at least \$140M in rural projects, which are exempt from the 20% local match




