



GOALS

Sustainability themes with comprehensive community-level aspirations

OBJECTIVES

A clear, desired outcome intended to move the community toward the goal

OUTCOME MEASURES

Community-scale results: measureable aim or purpose of each Objective

ACTION MEASURES

The steps a community takes to move the needle towards sustainability





Waste Minimization

Reduce and reuse material waste produced in the community

EVALUATION MEASURES Community-level Outcomes

Outcome: Total Solid Waste

Demonstrate incremental progress towards achieving a 100% reduction by 2050 in total solid waste generated within the jurisdiction that is disposed of via landfill or incinerator

Baseline Year	Years to 2050	Reduction per Year
2000	50	2.00%
2005	45	2.22%
2010	40	2.50%



EVALUATION MEASURESLocal Actions


- 1. Create a Waste Management Plan
- 2. Adopt specific product bans that will significantly advance progress towards waste reduction goals
- 3. Create a public education campaign or a targeted outreach effort for residents and businesses
- 4. Develop or participate in a regional coalition that enhances jurisdiction's ability to address waste management targets
- 5. Implement incentives or enforce regulations ensuring that residents and businesses work toward reductions targets
- 6. Provide services to enable residents and businesses to recycle and reduce their waste footprint
- 7. Collaboratively create and run at least 2 targeted recycling programs at key locations throughout the community
- 8. Operate at least two specific waste management programs for critical waste stream types found in the community
- 9. Create a waste-to-energy conversion system


