
Laurinburg-Maxton Airport

- Owned by Laurinburg & Maxton
- Operated by Authority appointed by Municipal Governing Boards
- Utilized as Airport & Industrial Park
- No municipal revenues allocated for operations at the Airport
- Located outside both city limits
- LMAC Ownership of WWTP in Laurel Hill serves industrial sites and community facilities
