122,185 stops **14% decrease**reported CY 2018




This metric tracks motor vehicle stops and searches made by the Austin Police Department and it is a state-mandated reporting requirement.



Why the Recommended Change:

- Using Austin population demographics doesn't take into account our many interactions with non-residents visiting Austin and those traveling through it.
- 2. As the goal is reducing racial disparities, the best benchmark should compare current results against a library of past APD interactions.

3. APD uses an Evidence-Based policing model that services areas impacted by crime, regardless of race, residence, or other variables.


Percentage of people who report they were treated fairly during our enforcement and judicial processes



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


Number and percentage of instances where people access court services other than in person (e.g. kiosk, mobile application, online, expanded hours)

Court cases adjudicated within time standards






