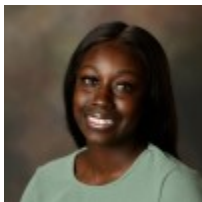
Jordan Wallace | Georgia Southern University

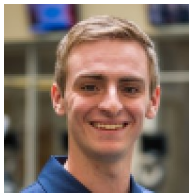
Emma Yourd | University of Pittsburgh

Her aspiration is to improve livelihood in impoverished communities and to be a city manager one day.



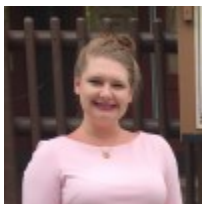
Danielle Littmann | University of Delaware

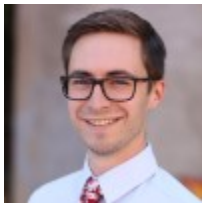
Harrison Fry | Murray State University
