Retaining Englewood Fire/Rescue



- Required a commitment and resources to capital equipment
- Required a commitment and resources toward additional personnel
- Required a commitment and resources toward making facilities functional and safe
- Status quo was not sustainable!

Must add ladder truck



Budgetary quote from Pierce for a new 110' aerial platform was \$1.3 million. Needed for high rise structures

Must replace 2 engines



Budgetary quote from Pierce for their Enforcer Engine was \$500,000 each

Must replace medic units



Budgetary quote from Wheeled Coach was \$200,000 each

Replace fire administration building

Fire administration building estimate was \$2,250,000



Replace Jefferson Station

Will require land acquisition to move station further to the east. Land estimated at \$1,633,500
Station cost was estimated to be \$4,500,000



Replace Acoma Station

Station cost was estimated to be \$3,000,000



Replace Tejon Fire Station

Station cost was estimated to be \$3,000,000



Hiring of 3 additional firefighters

Once the new ladder truck was in place, the City would have needed an additional firefighter for the three shifts to help fully staff the truck

The fully burdened cost of the three additional firefighter IV positions would have been \$226,971



Hiring of 2 fire inspectors

Since the City was maintaining the Fire Marshal function, two fire inspectors would have been needed to help with code compliance

The fully burdened cost of the inspectors would be \$151,314

Englewood	\$9,139,834	\$378,285	-	\$2,700,000	\$14,653,500	-	\$26,871,619
Denver	\$4,750,000	\$349,263	-	\$1,191,000	\$1,000,000	\$922,210	\$8,212,473
South Metro	\$6,496,146	\$457,785	\$504,810	\$(1,191,000)	\$12,298,500	\$922,210	\$19,488,451

Englewood Capital Needs

- Information Technology will require \$17 million over the next 20 years
- Total capital infrastructure for all departments outside of Public Safety after removing grants and other outside support is \$221,655,000!

Denver Fire





- Most viable economic alternative
- Provides the most resources
- City maintains local control through Fire Marshal function and tightly written IGA
- City would benefit from Denver's ISO 2 rating
- Each apparatus would have four-person staffing
- Denver Health would continue to transport to Swedish Hospital

Denver Fire



- Regionalization of fire leads to cost savings, elimination of duplicate services, consistency of equipment and procedures, equal training and performance standards, and adequate staffing
- Contract with Denver Fire afforded Englewood with the opportunity to address unmet capital project needs
- Contract with Denver Fire eliminated the immediate need for a property tax increase for public safety

Courageous Decision Prevented Trip to Ballot Box

Steps to Alternative Service Delivery

- Use the tools afforded by the Center for Priority Based Budgeting
- Examine your agency's strengths and capacity for service delivery
- Communicate, Communicate, Communicate
- Seek partnerships and opportunities for intergovernmental collaboration/cooperation
- Examine your employment contract
- Be strong and courageous

Basic Program Attributes

- Mandated to provide the program?
- Reliance on the City to provide the program?
- Change in demand for the program?
- Cost recovery of program?
- Portion of the City served by the program?

Intergovernmental Collaboration

- Who could help provide the program or service that you are challenged with?
- Are their opportunities for creating a special district or an authority?
- How much time do you have to invest in research and conversation with neighboring entities?
- Can your community enter into joint use agreements for service delivery?
- Where do the biggest opportunities exist for collaboration and cooperation amongst public entities?

Intergovernmental Collaboration


- Analyze the resources in your region to support the examination of alternative service delivery models.

- Difference between expectations and reality determines the magnitude of pain/stress


PBB and Change Commitment Denial Neutral

The Naked Eye






Use the PBB Lens for New Opportunities!
