- Technology Innovation Summit: Hannes Zacharias, County Administrator, Johnson County, Kansas, and NACA Regional Vice President for the Mountain Plains Region. He spoke candidly and offered helpful insights about cyber security at the NACo Annual Conference in Los Angeles County/Long Beach, California, during the second day of the summit. A key takeaway was his call for honesty and transparency when faced with cyberattacks as a means for collaboration and the advancement of cybersecurity.
