### RECENT NACo REPORT ON COUNTY FISCAL CHALLENGES

NACo just released its <u>Doing More with Less: State Revenue Limitations and Mandates on County Finances</u> report, accompanied by individualized state level profiles and data in NACo's interactive County Explorer. Building upon the foundation laid by NACo's <u>Counting Money</u> and <u>The State of County Finances</u> studies, this analysis examines county funding sources, state revenue limits, federal and state mandates on counties, new fiscal challenges and county fiscal solutions. This report sheds light on the factors behind the slow fiscal recovery of county governments and increasing pressures on local governments.
