Engagement

- 1. Public Meetings that are accessible/participatory
- 2. Intentional Board/Committee Appointments
- 3. Stakeholder Engagement
- 4. Volunteer Programs

Research shows that when people contribute to their communities they live longer, healthier, and more fulfilling lives





Case Study: Gwinnett County, Georgia

- 1 of 159 counties in the state of Georgia
- Nearly 1 million residents
- 3rd most diverse county in the southeast
- 4th most diverse county in the US
- 25% of Gwinnett's population is foreign-born
- Gwinnett's diversity index is 70% (US is 60%)
- Immigrant population quintupled in since 1990
- More than 100 languages spokes
- Leadership did not reflect the community

There was no civic infrastructure in place
